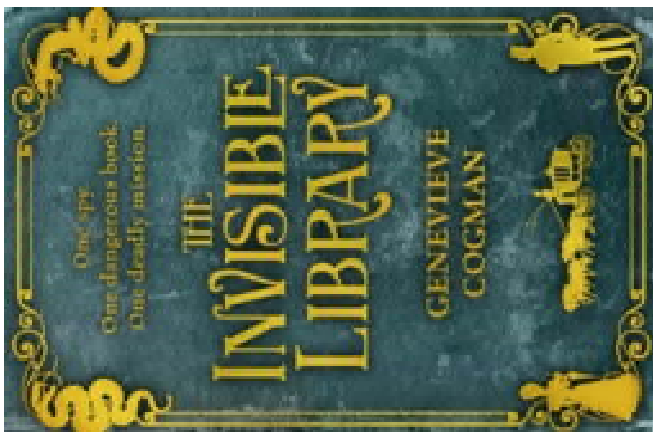
Ice Ghosts: The Epic Hunt for the Lost Franklin Expedition by Paul Watson **910.0919 F832w**
