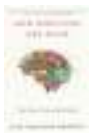

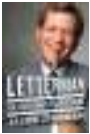
Juliet's Answer: One Man's Search for Love and the Elusive Cure for Heartbreak

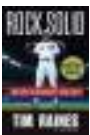
Molly on the Range: Recipes and Stories from an Unlikely Life on a Farm

 This memoir details the life and playing career of one of the sport's all-time greatest leaders and personalities, and is an honest, raw, and compelling tale of triumph and redemption.



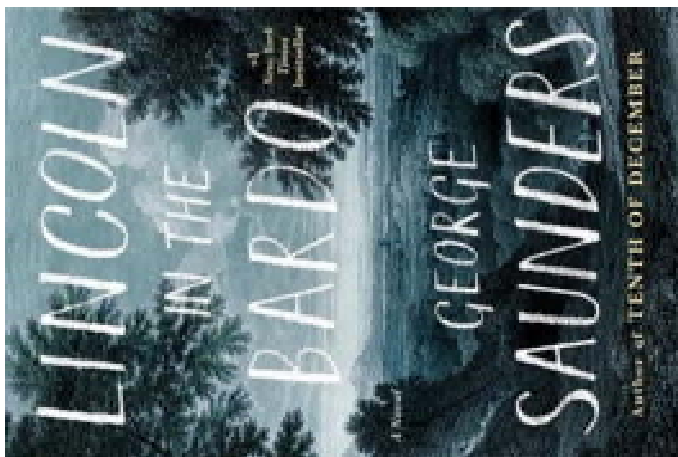
Jonathan Swift: The Reluctant Rebel by John Stubbs **820.92 S977s**
