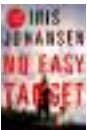

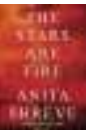

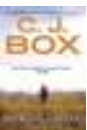

When she loses her high-profile job, Stacey leans on her career-minded friends and inadvertently exposes a betrayal that tests the limits of their bonds.

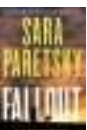

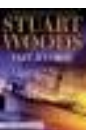

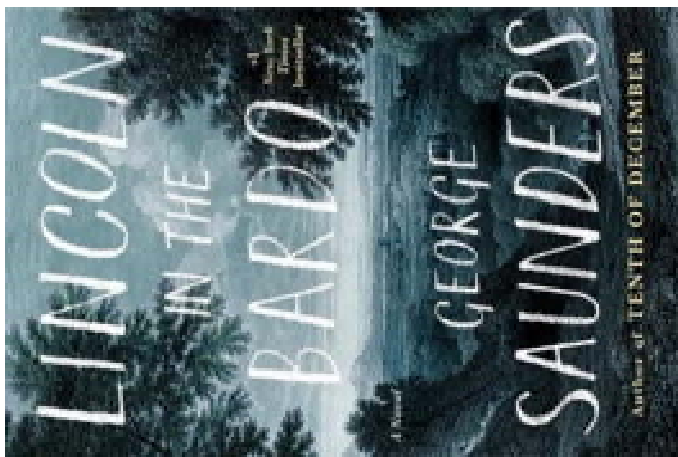


The Stranger in the Woods: The Extraordinary Story of the Last True Hermit
